### GIVE THANKS TO GOD

What is the nature of resurrection hope?

**Resurrection hope is a hope for the transformation of this world, not a hope for escape from it. It is the hope that evil in all its forms will be utterly eradicated, that past history will be redeemed, and that all the things that ever were will be made new. It is the hope of a new creation, a new heaven and a new earth, in which God is really honored as God, human beings are truly loving, and peace and justice reign on earth.**

Life-giving God, we pray for loved ones . . . Help those who suffer; restore them, body and soul. Walk beside them through every dark valley. Feed them with mercy; anoint them with healing. By your grace, O God, **raise us from death to life.**

Eternal God, show forth in us and in our world the good news of your saving power and love, so that all may believe and have life in you; through Jesus Christ, who is risen indeed. **Amen.**

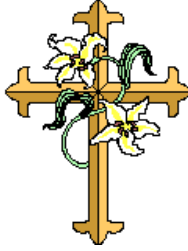
